Welcome to worship at Grace Presbyterian Church.

Today is the seventh Sunday of the season of Easter, which extends through the Great Fifty Days from Easter Day through Pentecost (April 21 – June 9, 2019). This joyful season of the resurrection victory is celebrated in worship through our hymns, the Gloria and Doxology for the season, and an affirmation of faith in place of a prayer of confession. It has long been customary to omit confession of sin during the Easter season as an expression of the absolute victory over sin won for us by the Risen Lord. Today we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord into heaven, which occurred forty days from the resurrection according to Acts 1. The Ascension is the "bridge," linking the final verses of Luke's Gospel and the opening verses of the Book of Acts, which was also written by Luke. Next Sunday is the Day of Pentecost, when the promised power from on high, the Holy Spirit, descended upon the disciples.
