Welcome to worship at Grace Presbyterian Church. Today we conclude the Christmas cycle with the Epiphany. January 6 may be the date of the most ancient observance of the Nativity. In the Western Church (Roman Catholic and Protestant) Epiphany focuses upon the arrival of the Magi or Wise Men, as recorded in Matthew 2, the significance of which – the welcoming of the Gentiles – is indicated in the epistle lesson from Ephesians 3.
