The first Sunday in October has been observed as World Communion Sunday, especially by American Protestants of the Reformed/Presbyterian family. The first observance of World Communion Sunday is often dated to 1933 at Shadyside Presbyterian in Pittsburgh PA. The idea spread among Presbyterians and soon among other Protestant church bodies. Communion will be available at this service as we come to the Communion table, or a Communion station at the back of the church, maintaining social distance. As a reminder, church doctrine has long held that taking only the bread or only the cup is still a full and valid Communion. For those at the service who prefer not to take Communion and for those watching on livestream, Pastor Krech will offer a prayer for spiritual Communion.

Commitment/Pledge Sunday and Reformation Sunday – October 25

On October 25, there will be an opportunity in worship to place commitment cards on the Communion table. You may also return your commitment cards prior to that date by placing them in the or mailing them to the church. Also that day we celebrate Reformation Sunday, taking note of some of the doctrines and singing some of the hymns that have been central to our identity as Christians in the Protestant tradition, and the Reformed family, influenced by John Calvin on the Sunday nearest October 31, the date in the year 1517 usually identified as the beginning of the Protestant Reformation with Martin Luther's 95 theses.
