Welcome to worship at Grace Presbyterian Church. Today is the sixth Sunday of Easter. We celebrate Jesus' victory over sin and death through the Great Fifty Days of Easter, including Ascension Day, this coming Thursday, May 21, and culminating with Pentecost on May 31. In John 14, Jesus prepares the disciples for his departure in the crucifixion. The same preparation for departure is timely now on the eve of the Ascension, when Jesus will once again depart from the believers into heaven.

In Acts 17 Paul proclaims Jesus and the resurrection to the Athenians, few of whom believe. In 1 Peter 3 Christians are urged to suffer when necessary because Jesus died for us and preached to the spirits in prison.

Another theme today through the hymns is the beauty and wonder of God's creation, traditionally observed as Rogation Days, days of prayer for a successful planting of crops on the three days before Ascension Day. (JMK)
