### Congregational Meeting to Elect Elders, Class of 2024

Welcome to worship at Grace Presbyterian Church. Today is Reformation Sunday. The Protestant Reformation is often dated to October 31, 1517, with Martin Luther's (1483-1546) 95 theses, items for debate. Through the remainder of the 16<sup>th</sup> century, Protestantism spread throughout Europe, emphasizing the authority of scripture, justification by grace through faith, the priesthood of all believers, the Christian vocation of laypersons, and more inclusive church government. Presbyterianism is part of the Reformed Tradition within Protestant Christianity, looking to John Calvin (1509-1564) and an emphasis on the sovereignty of God and the office of Elder (*presbuteros* in Greek). Many Protestants came to North America in the seventeenth century and later. The first, second, and final hymns in today's service are three of the best-known hymns of the era of the Protestant Reformation.
