This observance is the most recent on the church calendar, having been begun in 1925 by Pope Pius XI to affirm the lordship of Christ in the midst of the rising secularism in Europe and much of the world following World War I. For the church today, including us Protestants, The Reign of Christ the King marks the culmination of the long season following Pentecost and rightly foreshadows the coming season of Advent whose themes include Christ's return in glory to judge the world.
