

Today we conclude the Sundays after Epiphany with the account of the Transfiguration of Jesus. This is an appropriate final lesson for the season of light. Epiphany began with the light of a star, guiding the magi to Jesus' cradle; today that light is shining in the face of Jesus on the mountaintop. Peter, John, and James, are granted this vision of the glorified Christ, which encourages their faith as shadows arise when Jesus sets his face toward Jerusalem and takes up the cross.

The Transfiguration can help sustain our faith during the coming season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022.
