

Today is the sixth Sunday of the season of Easter, also called Eastertide, which extends from Easter Day, April 17, through the 50th day of Easter, the Day of Pentecost, June 5, 2022. We celebrate this joyful season of the resurrection victory through hymns, the Gloria and Doxology for the season, and an affirmation of faith in place of a prayer of confession. It is a custom in the church of long standing to omit confession of sin during the Easter season as an affirmation of the complete victory over sin won for us by the Risen Lord. Today's hymns reflect another theme for the sixth Sunday of Easter: Rogation Days, the three weekdays prior to Ascension Day, were given to prayer for a fruitful season of planting and harvest. The first and second hymns today celebrate God's creation of and care for the world. Ascension Day, the 40th day of Easter, is Thursday, May 26, 2022.
